This week, we welcome Pastor Elaine Dent to lead us in Worship.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

By now you have already probably heard that the prognosticator of all prognosticators (Punxsutawney Phil) has predicted that winter will continue for six more weeks. I know that for many people, this is not good news. Of course, for some kids, this means there is hope for more winter snow and a few days out of school! But whether we greet this prediction with dread or hope, Groundhog's Day ties us to a Church tradition which always delivers good news and hope.

The date of Groundhog's Day always coincides with the date of Candlemas. Since the 5th century AD, this has been a festival of candles. For many years, churches often blessed all the candles they planned to use in the coming year on this day and still many churches bless candles for church and home use on this day. Candlemas is celebrated on February 2 annually because that is the date of the Presentation of our Lord. As we observed on Sunday, this is the time when Jesus was brought to the temple by Mary and Joseph to be dedicated to God. According to Luke unlike other dedications, two seniors at the temple that day proclaim clearly that Jesus is the one to redeem Israel, the promised Messiah. So, a great Epiphany occurs this day for all who gather in the temple, and we clearly hear who Jesus is from both Simeon and Anna.

Even though there seems to be no connection between candles and groundhogs, there actually is a connection. For many European countries, Candlemas was a day for weather predictions. For some this date, right between the winter solstice and the equinox was celebrated as the beginning of Spring. Because agriculture was so central, these predictions were important. The Germans looked to see if a badger cast a shadow or not that day for their predictions. But when many Germans moved to the new world, there were no badgers to be found, so the tradition of using a groundhog took shape. Even today we celebrate the Presentation of our Lord with Candlemas on Groundhog's Day.

As Simeon sings that day, Jesus is a light to the world. Whether Phil sees his shadow or not, we continue to use candles for worship. Every time we light a candle, we have a sign of hope reminding us that the eternal light is still with us. When we use candles for worship, we remember that Christ is with us. When you light a candle at home, remember that Christ is there with you. Even in the darkness of winter, Christ is with us always offering hope!
